SAFETY SPOTLIGHT

Preventing and Responding to Insect Stings

Beacon events take as a water well professional during summer months require employees take you to work outdoors, it's important to be prepared for the risk of insect stings.

Other all, insects such as bees, wasps, and hornets are common throughout the state of Illinois—often creating nests or burrows within the cracks or crevices of roofs, in the branches, or even on various types of equipment.

While an insect sting might only cause minor side effects for you, the same sting could result in life-threatening allergic reactions for others. What's more, any individual who receives multiple stings at a time or as a result of experiencing complications from insect poisoning—including a headache, fever, dizziness, nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea.

With this in mind, review the following guidance to help prevent insect stings on the job and respond appropriately in the event you or a co-worker gets stung.

Preventing Insect Stings

- Consider the use of insect repellent.
- Wear clean, light-colored, tight-fitting clothes that cover most of your body to limit your exposure.
- Try to avoid using any scented soap, shampoo, deodorant, perfume, or cologne—these can attract insects.
- Get rid of any food scraps to avoid attracting insects to the jobsite.

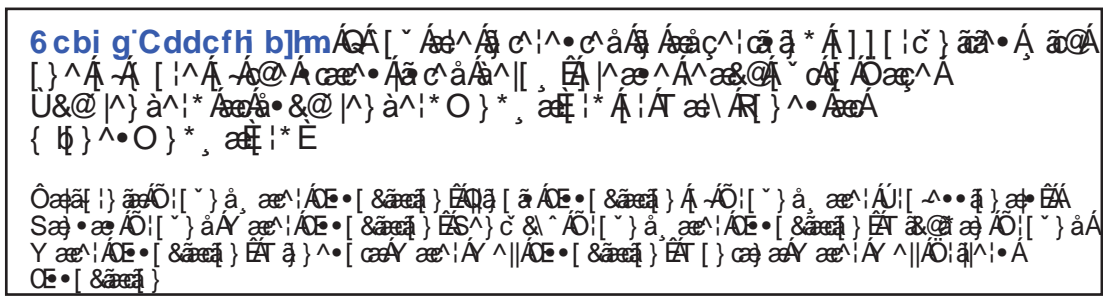
Responding to Insect Stings

- If you or a co-worker gets stung on the job, tell your supervisor immediately. Have someone else with you or your co-worker to walk to the edge of an allergic reaction such as excess swelling and dizziness or breath.
- Wash the site of the sting with soap and water.
- Remove the stinger by wiping the sting site with gauze or a clean cloth. Do not use tweezers or a needle to remove the stinger as this can increase swelling.
- If you or your co-worker shows signs of an allergic reaction, seek medical attention immediately.
